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Note on Goodrich Surname Genealogies: Goodridge Family

The editor recently had an unusual, recurring experience that led to a search for a Goodrich descendant, Dr. John Pearl Goodrich, MD (b. 1894), a medical doctor at St. Andrews Hospital in Boothbay Harbor, Maine who married twice but had no known children, and so no descendants. Research revealed that Dr. John Pearl Goodrich descends from immigrant William⁻¹ Goodridge of Watertown, Massachusetts. His Goodridge ancestry became Goodrich when it moved from Newbury, Essex, Massachusetts to Enfield, Grafton, New Hampshire between 1790 and 1800, and then it moved to Orange County, Vermont where he was born and resided before 1920.

Research of Dr. John Pearl Goodrich published in this issue provided an opportunity to utilize *The Goodridge Genealogy* (1918),¹ for an ancestry with 1 generation born in New Hampshire and 3 generations born in Vermont; usually a daunting genealogical tracking scenario. Though *The Goodridge Genealogy* is criticized for inaccuracies in the English history for the immigrant William⁻¹ Goodridge/Goodrich of Watertown, including a mistaken emphasis on the Goodridge surname,^{2,3} its information for his line was consistently ~80% accurate (Figure 28; page 26).

Early History of Goodrich School, Newtonville, Town of Colonie, Albany, New York

The Dutch families who settled in this area in the 1600's and 1700's held some classes for children in homes and churches, usually taught by the "Domine" or minister. They wanted to make sure the children would be able to read the Bible, as well as conduct their affairs when they became adults.

After the Revolutionary War, many families migrated from New England where education was most important to their industrious way of life.

The first Governor of New York State, George Clinton, can well be called the "Father of Education." With his encouragement, the legislature voted on the "Common School System" in 1812. Records show, however, schools had been established and were being supported by this community as early as 1795. As a result of the Act of 1812, the following year, the Town of Watervliet (Mother of all the towns in Albany County) was divided into School Districts. Goodrich School, #12, was probably started about 1821, as up until then there were only 11 districts on record. Also, land was deeded to Abraham Dyer about that time and the school was first known as Dyer School. The land was later owned by the Goodrich family and the name eventually was changed. The area was called West Albany until 1895, then became a part of Colonie, which was incorporated that year.

Instead of a Board of Education there was one Trustee, with a Clerk and Collector. After 1920, Trustees were increased to three. A District Commissioner kept records for the State.

Mr. Raymond Carvill was the Trustee in the early 1900's and recalls the one-room school house with its pot-bellied stove, outside bathroom facilities (the outhouse) and drinking water carried from the nearby Dyer Farm. The classroom held all ages, 5 to 18. Parents had to pay the teacher's salary in equal proportion to the number of children they sent to school. They could also pay in firewood or supplies or furnished room and board for the teacher. Before the 1870's the teachers were usually men, because they had to keep fires going in the wood stoves and maintain discipline with all the students. By the 1900's the caliber of teachers improved, as Teachers' colleges became more numerous and ladies received instructions.

Mrs. Louella Onderdonk was Principal and Teacher at Goodrich School from about 1921 to 1942. The old one-room wooden structure burned in 1920, and a brick building with three rooms and an auditorium was built to take its place. Mrs. Onderdonk recalls that with three rooms, the classes were two or three to each room. The students who were well-behaved were privileged to help the teacher after school. One of the favorite tasks was cleaning the erasers, probably in a great cloud of dust.

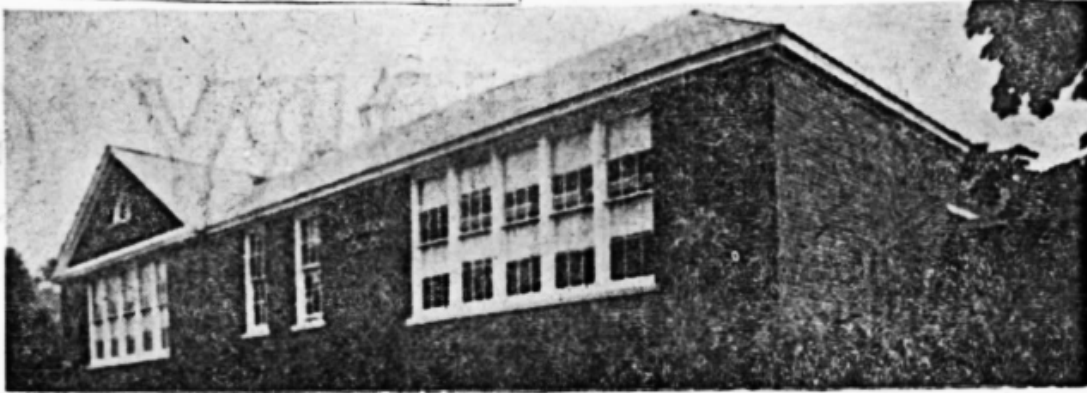
The schools in Colonie were centralized in 1950, at which time plans were made to obtain more land. In 1955, three classrooms, a cafeteria, Principal's Office, Nurses office and Faculty room were added. By 1958 another six rooms, Library, Gymnasium and all modern facilities for pupils and teachers were completed to make it a 12-room building.

Mrs. Laura Burt was Principal from 1942 to 1966. Mr. Alton Downer, Principal from 1966-1967. Mr. Robert Farrell is Principal at the present time.

Colonie school rich in history

EDITOR'S NOTE: *When the Goodrich Elementary School closes this June - a victim of the North Colonie School District's declining enrollment - more than 300 students will be reassigned and many teachers and administrators will be shuffled to new posts. School officials are working to make Goodrich's last year a special one, and the closing has created renewed interest in the history of the school and the surrounding area.*

LATHAM — The area where the Goodrich School stands is rich in history dating back to the 1600 and 1700's, according to an early history of the area compiled by town historian Jean Olton.

Dutch families in the neighborhood first held classes for children in homes and churches with the classes generally taught by the local minister. The families wanted to make sure their offspring could read the Bible and be able to conduct their business affairs in later life.

Following the Revolutionary War, a number of families migrated from New England to the area around the school on Fiddlers Lane. Those New England families, like the Dutch, believed education was important to their industrious way of life.

Although the "Common School System" was established by the

legislature in 1812 following the leadership of New York State's first Governor George Clinton, records indicate schools had been established and were being supported in the Goodrich School area as early as 1795.

In 1813, however, the Town of Watervliet was divided into school districts. Goodrich School, #12, was probably started in 1821, since up until then only 11 districts were on record. About that time the land was also deeded to Abraham Dyer and the Goodrich School was first known as the Dyer School.

The land was later owned by the Goodrich family and the name eventually changed.

The area where the school stood was called (West Troy) until 1895 when it became part of Colonie, which incorporated that year.

Instead of a board of education, there was one trustee with a clerk and collector. After 1920, the number of trustees was

increased to three and a district commissioner kept records for the state.

Mrs. Olton said Raymond Carvill, the trustee in the early 1900's, recalled for her the one-room school house with its pot-bellied stove, outhouse and drinking water which was carried from the nearby Dyer farm.

The classroom held all ages then, from 5 to 18-years-old and parents had to pay the teacher's salary in equal proportion to the number of children they had in school. But money wasn't the only payment — families could pay in firewood or supplies, or furnish room and board for the teacher.

Prior to 1870, most of the teacher were men because they had to keep the fires going and maintain student discipline, Mrs. Olton said. Women started being teachers around 1900.

The one-room wooden school structure burned in 1920 and a brick building with three rooms and an auditorium was built to take

its place.

Louella Onderdonk, Goodrich's principal from the early 1920s to 1942 recalled to Mrs. Olton that with three rooms, two to three classes were housed in each room.

Following the school's centralization in 1950, three classrooms, a cafeteria, principal's office, nurse's office and faculty were added. By 1958, another six rooms, the library, gymnasium and modernized facilities were built to make the building 12 rooms total.

Laura Burt was principal from 1942 to 1966 followed by Alton Downer, Robert Farrell, who now is principal at the Forts Ferry School.

Robert Baker is the current principal of the Goodrich School which has 333 students.

The Goodrich School is located on the northwest corner of Fiddlers Lane and Alva Drive in the Albany County town of Colonie, New York. The immediate area in which the nominated property lies is largely residential in character. The north elevation of the school rests close to Fiddlers Lane, the entrance flanked on either side by ornamental shrubs. Immediately west of the building is a large, rectangular parking lot, bounded by residential properties. East of the school is a playground which gives way to a large, open field. The property is well screened from the adjoining residences to the south by a stand of evergreen trees. The present-day Goodrich School was the location of an earlier one-room wood schoolhouse, constructed in the early nineteenth century and destroyed by fire in the 1920s. Included in the nomination is a parcel consisting of approximately 12 acres of land and one contributing building.

The Goodrich School is comprised of a one-story, gable-ended rectangular block, c. 1922, with a one-story, rectangular hipped-roof wing, c. 1926. Extending from the south elevation of the historic building is an early 1950s rectangular addition, with a subsequent late 1950s addition. Although physically connected, the non-historic additions fail to affect the overall character of the 1920s school. Constructed in the Colonial Revival style, the Goodrich School is built of brick laid in a common-bond and rests on a foundation of poured concrete. A low-pitched, slate shingle-clad roof covers the early block. The principal facade faces north and is symmetrically composed, the entrance flanked by blind panels that maintain the rhythm of the building in the absence of windows. The rectangular panels are composed of three units each, formed by a course of raised stretcher bricks aligned horizontally along the vertical elevation. A second course of raised stretchers, aligned vertically, provides additional emphasis. An entrance to the basement, flanked by casements on either side, is set below the water table on the raised concrete foundation. The school is accessed by twin glazed and paneled wood doors, surmounted by a fanlight. The north elevation features a prominent portico with curved underside, carried by six fluted Doric columns resting on a poured concrete porch. The doorway is accentuated by twin pilasters, a wood keystone, and simple surround. A shallow boxed wood cornice is carried around the entire block. Rising from the central axis of school is a handsome, octagonal wood cupola with a copper roof, consisting of louvered rounded arches divided by pilasters.

The west gable-end elevation features a full pediment, the tympanum of which features a glazed lunette. The lunette rests on a slightly projecting concrete sill, and is emphasized by a course of header bricks. Fenestration consists of a centrally-placed window band, comprised of five windows of six-over-six double hung wood sash. The band rises to meet the boxed-cornice at the building's eaves. The east gable-end is similarly composed, excepting that the individual windows in the band are comprised of four-over-four sash.

Kevin Franklin, the current Historian of the Town of Colonie, contributed by email the historical 1969 article by past Historian Jean Olton, who died last year aged ~100 years, and the exhibits on pages 3-5. Kevin states the Goodrich family is intimately associated with the history of the town of Colonie; formerly Watervliet, Albany, NY. The Goodrich school is on the National Register of Historic Places (above).

I received the following repeat query from ResearchGate (*now in 5 of the last 6 months*):

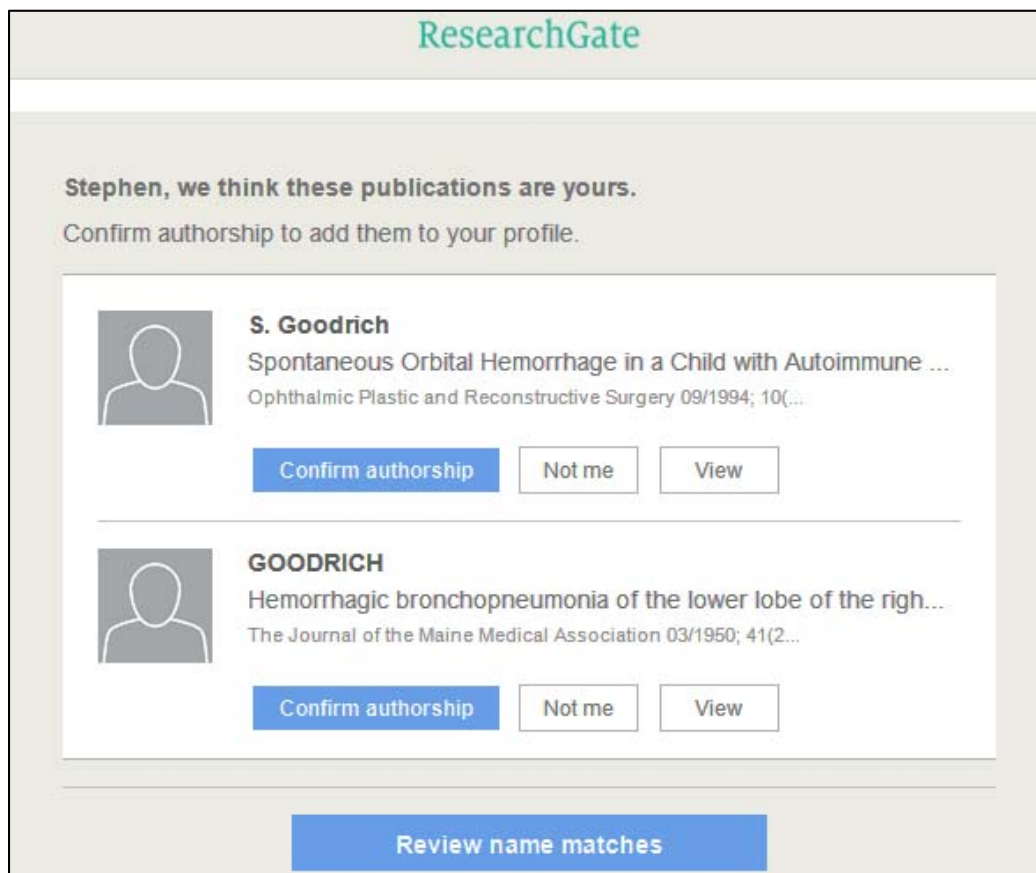

I was not a co-author of either of these two articles, of which, at least in a chronological sense, only the first article, published in September, 1994, could have been co-authored by me.

Conversely, a surviving author of an article published in March, 1950 would probably be past age 100 now. Even a child born in March, 1950 would now be age 68; ~13 years older than I am. I suspected there was a malfunction in the ResearchGate database, and when the query was not repeated in December, it seemed the issue was resolved. But then it returned 4 more times. I tried to find the second article: “Hemorrhagic Bronchopneumonia of the Lower Lobe of the Right...” in the March, 1950 (volume 41) issue of *The Journal of the Maine Medical Association*. I was greeted with another surprise: there is no such article, or any other article with a co-author named Goodrich in the March, 1950 issue.⁵

However, 3 articles in the February, 1950 issue did mention a Dr. John P. Goodrich, MD of the St. Andrews Hospital in Boothbay Harbor, Lincoln, Maine; he had co-authored 2 of them:⁶

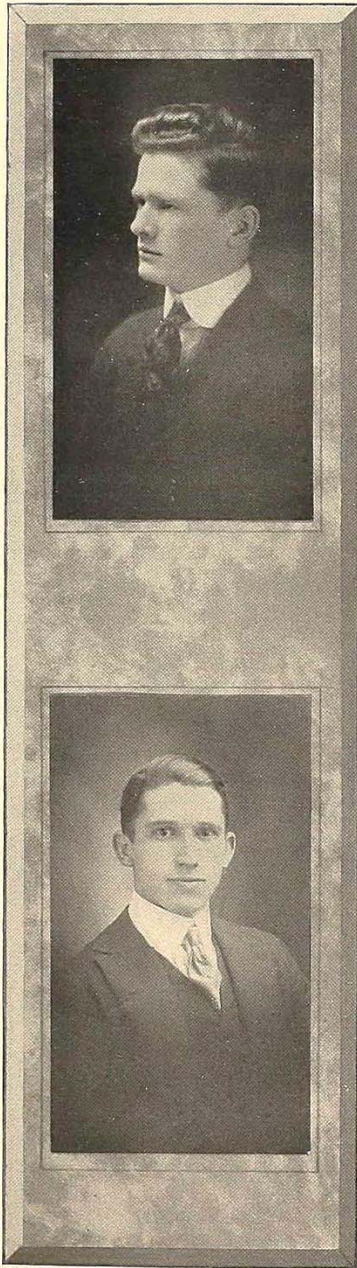
- “Duodenal Ulcers Occurring in Twins” (pp 40, 45), John P. Goodrich, MD, Philip O. Gregory, MD.⁷
 - Article pp 40, 45 are on pages 10-11 (note near the end of p 45: “...new antibacterial agent [streptomycin].”)
- “Hydronephrosis without Urinary Tract Manifestation” (pp 41-42), John P. Goodrich, MD.⁸
- “Clinico-Pathological Exercise Held at St. Andrews Hospital – April 26, 1949” (pp 43-45), no stated authors.⁹
 - A clinical case of sudden death (08 Apr 1949) due to hemorrhagic bronchopneumonia of the lower lobe of the right lung is described; the cited title “Hemorrhagic bronchopneumonia...”¹⁰ is a finding aid for researchers.

Dr. John P. Goodrich appeared to be John Pearl Goodrich, who on 29 May 1917 was a single, 3rd-year medical student at the University of Vermont, Burlington (Figure 2) and resident of South Royalton when he registered for World War I military service. He was born 15 May 1894 in East Randolph, Orange, Vermont; he was inducted 5 months after he registered (Figure 1).

DUODENAL ULCERS OCCURRING IN TWINS

JOHN P. GOODRICH, M. D., and PHILIP O. GREGORY, M. D., St. Andrews Hospital

CASE I—W. C., white male, laborer, age 21, married, referred for X-ray of stomach November 22, 1949, giving a history of stomach ulcers of five years standing.



X-ray of stomach of W. C. showing dilatation and hyperperistalsis, also the bulbar deformity.

Family History: Unimportant except that a twin brother suffers from similar stomach trouble.

Past History: Usual children's diseases, appendectomy five years ago, otherwise negative.

Chief Complaint: Inability to eat.

Present Illness: Patient has suffered periodic attacks of nausea and epigastric distress for the past five years. During this time treatment by diet and medication has given no lasting relief.

Physical Examination: Patient underweight. Skin, mucous membranes and conjunctivae pale. Localized tenderness in right upper quadrant, scar of appendectomy, otherwise negative. Temperature, pulse and respirations normal, blood pressure 120/70. Blood count — hemoglobin 76%, red blood count 3,870,000, white blood count 9,250, differential normal. Urine normal. Gastric analysis shows fasting free HCl 28°, no free HCl after administration of test meal.

X-ray: Stomach large and low without deformity. Peristaltic waves frequent and deep. Pylorus normal.

Duodenum—bulbar deformity with niche about 1 cm. in diameter on posterior wall near lesser curvature. Obstruction not sufficient to cause retention.

Patient was admitted to the hospital November 25, 1949, and after the usual preparation underwent a partial gastrectomy (Polya), November 28, 1949. A dilated stomach and an ulcer in the duodenal bulb admitting the tip of the examining finger were found. Usual postoperative treatment was carried out and patient was discharged from the hospital on the seventh postoperative day improved.

Pathological report on resected portion of stomach by Dr. Goodof.

Chronic hypertrophic gastritis.

CASE II—M. C., white male, laborer, age 21, single, referred for X-ray of stomach December 1, 1949, stating that he had suffered from stomach trouble for about two years.

Family History: Twin brother had similar stomach ailment, otherwise not important.

Past History: No bearing on present illness.

Chief Complaint: Pain in stomach.

placed by tumor tissue identical with that seen in the stomach. The liver presents nodules of tumor measuring up to 5 cm. in diameter; umbilicated and fairly sharply defined. These nodules occupy approximately 30% of the volume.

The left pleura shows diffuse infiltration by neoplastic tissue. The upper lobe of the right lung presents several firm nodules of tumor, averaging 5 mm. in diameter. The lower lobe of the right lung is almost completely involved in a hemorrhagic process of consolidation. The left lung is edematous.

Microscopically the tumor shows a characteristic small cell type of growth with infiltration of these tumor cells between muscle bundles and distinct invasion of lymphatics. There is a moderate desmoplastic tendency in all areas involved by tumor.

The autopsy findings do not provide an adequate explanation for the hemoptysis noted a year ago. There is very little question but that the gastric lesion was present at that time. The pulmonary metastases, however, were small and undoubtedly of relatively recent occurrence.

The immediate cause of death is probably the hemorrhagic bronchopneumonia of the lower lobe of the right lung. It is possible that the final episodes, producing a picture of collapse, may have been due to intracranial metastases. The brain, however, was not examined. The heart itself showed only minimal sclerotic changes and cannot be incriminated for the acute terminal episodes."

Present Illness: For the past two years patient has suffered epigastric pain for which he has obtained no relief by diet or medication.

Physical Examination: Patient of normal weight. Skin, mucous membranes and conjunctivae of normal color. Slight epigastric tenderness, otherwise negative. Temperature, pulse and respirations normal. Blood pressure 130/76. Blood count — hemoglobin 90%, red blood count 4,470,000, white blood count 5,750, differential normal. Urine normal. Gastric analysis shows fasting free HCl 25°, after test meal free HCl increased to 70°.

X-ray: Stomach hypertonic, no deformities, peristaltic waves frequent and deep. Pylorus normal.

Duodenum — bulbar deformity with niche about 1 cm. in diameter on posterior wall near lesser curvature side. No obstruction.

Patient was admitted to the hospital December 2, 1949, and after the usual preparation underwent a partial gastrectomy (Polya), December 5, 1949. A normal size stomach and an ulcer in the duodenal bulb

admitting the tip of the examining finger were found. Usual postoperative treatment was carried out and patient was discharged from the hospital on the seventh postoperative day improved.

Pathological report on resected portion of stomach by Dr. Goodof.

Chronic hypertrophic gastritis.

We do not know the results of the surgical treatment of these cases as they are too recent for such evaluation. They are reported at this time because of the occurrence of similar peptic ulcers in identical twins with almost identical symptoms and identical medical treatment without response. The first, with symptoms of five years duration had a moderately dilated stomach indicating slight obstruction, also a moderate degree of anemia. The second, with symptoms of two years duration, had no stomach dilatation and no anemia. The location and size of the duodenal ulcers were the same as determined by X-ray examination and surgery.

Of the deaths from respiratory tuberculosis in 1947, 32.1 percent occurred outside of institutions, and 67.9 percent occurred in institutions. Of the total respiratory tuberculosis deaths, 25.8 percent occurred in general hospitals, 30.9 percent in tuberculosis hospitals and sanatoria, and 9.0 percent in mental hospitals. — Sara A. Lewis (biostatistician), *Pub. Health Rep.*, April 1, 1949.

Carefully documented studies on the use of streptomycin in clinical tuberculosis have established the fact

that this new anti-bacterial agent exerts a beneficial therapeutic effect on several forms of tuberculosis. At its best, however, it is only an auxiliary part of the general treatment in most forms of the disease, and is partially dependent, for its full effect, upon other more common therapeutic measures, such as bed rest, pneumothorax, and chest surgery. (Recommendations of the Subcommittee on Streptomycin of the Expert Committee on Tuberculosis of the World Health Organization, January, 1949.)

In the 1900 US Census for Randolph, Orange, Vermont, John P. Goodrich (b. May 1894), son of farmer John B. (b. Feb 1864) and Emma Goodrich (b. Oct 1862; m. 12 years), has siblings Julian (b. Jun 1888), Edith (b. Mar 1891), and George (b. Mar 1897; Figure 3). Before the 1910 US Census, livestock buyer John B. (47) and Emma (48) Goodrich and their five children: Julian (21), Edith (19), J. Pearl (15), George (13), and Celia (7) moved to Royalton, Windsor, Vermont (Figure 4).¹⁴ By the 1920 US Census, John P. Goodrich became a physician at Bangor State Hospital in Bangor, Penobscot, Maine (Figure 5).

Dr. John Pearl Goodrich married widow Isabelle E. O'Leary 26 Jun 1920 at Waterville, Kennebec, Maine (Figure 6). Isabelle Esther Traynor had first married James J. O'Leary 12 Feb 1917 at Bangor (Figure 6). They had no children in their Waterville, Kennebec, Maine household in 1930 or in 1940, but shared their home with 3 siblings of Esther in 1930 (Figure 7), and with a servant and 2 boarders in 1940 (Figure 8).

John P. Goodrich and wife Esther Goodrich arrived at the Port of New York, New York on 02 Feb 1939; their arrival record (Figure 9) reconciles Dr. John P. Goodrich with Randolph, Vermont (Figures 1, 3, 6) and Waterville, Maine (Figures 7, 8), and reveals his wife Esther was b. 05 Apr 1896 in Bangor, Maine.

For no apparent reason that can be seen in the original record, and conflicting with the 29 May 1917 claim by John P. Goodrich that he was natural-born (Figure 1), the Ancestry.com index of their arrival lists the ethnicity/nationality of passengers John P. Goodrich and Esther Goodrich as Japanese (Figure 10).

Esther (Traynor-O’Leary) Goodrich died in Boston, Suffolk, Massachusetts in 1949 (Figure 11),²⁴ and the next year widower Dr. John Pearl Goodrich of Boothbay Harbor, Lincoln, Maine, married 09 Mar 1950²⁵ Meverett S Shackford,²⁶ b. 31 Jan 1890²⁷ in Rutland, Rutland, Vermont (Figure 12).²⁸ Meverett was married to Pearl George Butler²⁹ from 18 Jan 1927 (Figure 12)³⁰ until he died 31 Jan 1948 (Figure 14).³¹

John and Meverett (Shackford-Butler) Goodrich, both natives of Vermont, honeymooned in Bermuda from 11 Mar 1950 (Figure 13)³² through 17 Mar 1950,³³ sailing on the *Queen of Bermuda*.

No further information regarding Dr. John Pearl Goodrich, MD has been found so far, and though his date of death has not been found in a Maine, Social Security, or Massachusetts index, an unsourced individual family record states that he died 18 Oct 1954 in Boston,³⁴ where first wife Esther I. (Traynor) Goodrich died in 1949.³⁵ Meverett Goodrich died 04 Aug 1972 in Boothbay Harbor, Maine (Figure 14).³⁶

Dr. John Pearl Goodrich, MD was a descendant of the immigrant William¹ Goodrich/Goodridge of Watertown, Massachusetts; his line lived in Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont, Maine: **JOHN⁹ PEARL GOODRICH (JOHN⁸, JOSEPH⁷, JOSEPH⁶, ABIEL⁵, JEREMIAH⁴, JEREMIAH³, JEREMIAH², WILLIAM¹)**

In the following genealogical exercise, the published ancestry of Dr. John Pearl Goodrich, MD in *The Goodridge Genealogy* (1918) by Dr. Edwin Alonzo Goodridge, MD,⁴³ is corroborated with vital records from generations 1-8, culminating with a table in Figure 42 on page 41 in which the accuracy of the published genealogy is scored.

ABIEL⁻⁵ GOODRIDGE/GOODRICH (in *The Goodridge Genealogy*)⁶¹

33. **ABIEL⁻⁵ GOODRIDGE** (Jeremiah⁻⁴, Jeremiah⁻³, Jeremiah⁻², William⁻¹) was born in Newbury, Mass., May 23, 1750. He served in the Revolution with credit.

He married, in Haverhill, Mass., October 25, 1775, **RACHEL FOLLANSBEE**, born in Haverhill October 10, 1756, daughter of Moses and Priscilla (Heath) Follansbee. The Follansbees had long been distinguished in English history. Rachel was in the fifth generation in this country, her line being Thomas¹, who came from England about 1650, Thomas², William³, Moses⁴. After marriage, in 1775, he settled in Haverhill, soon after removing to Newbury, where he resided until 1788, when he removed again to Enfield, Grafton County, NH.

Through this county and across the Connecticut River into Orange County, Vt., Abiel and his wife had a numerous progeny. Lebanon, Enfield, Canaan, Grafton and Ware in New Hampshire; Williamstown, Brookfield, Chelsea, Bradford and Orange in Vermont, each became the abiding place of one or more of the families descended from this notable couple. In giving the birthplace and residence of the different individuals in this history often only the county is stated because the particular town is not known, but it was always either Grafton County, NH or Orange County, Vt.

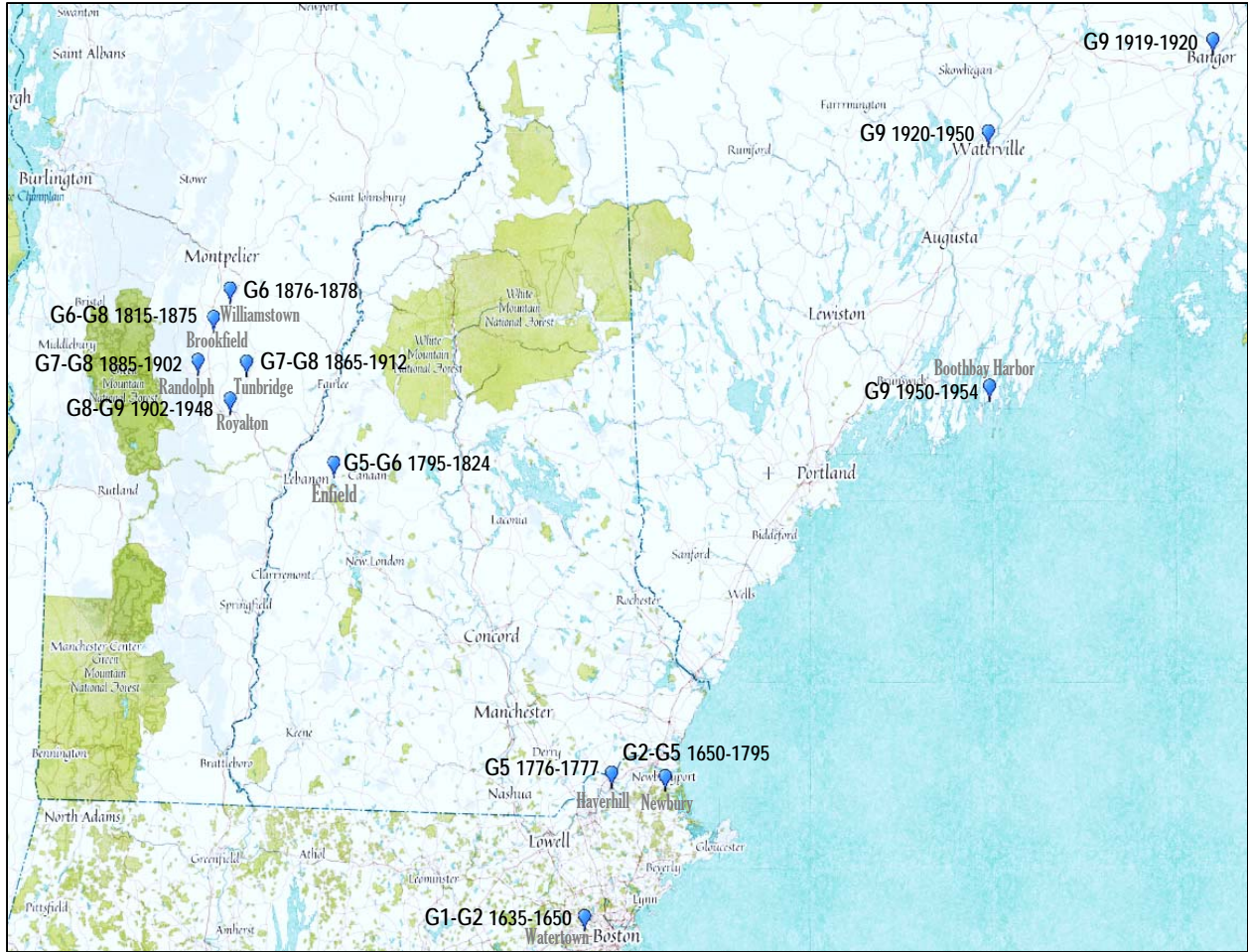

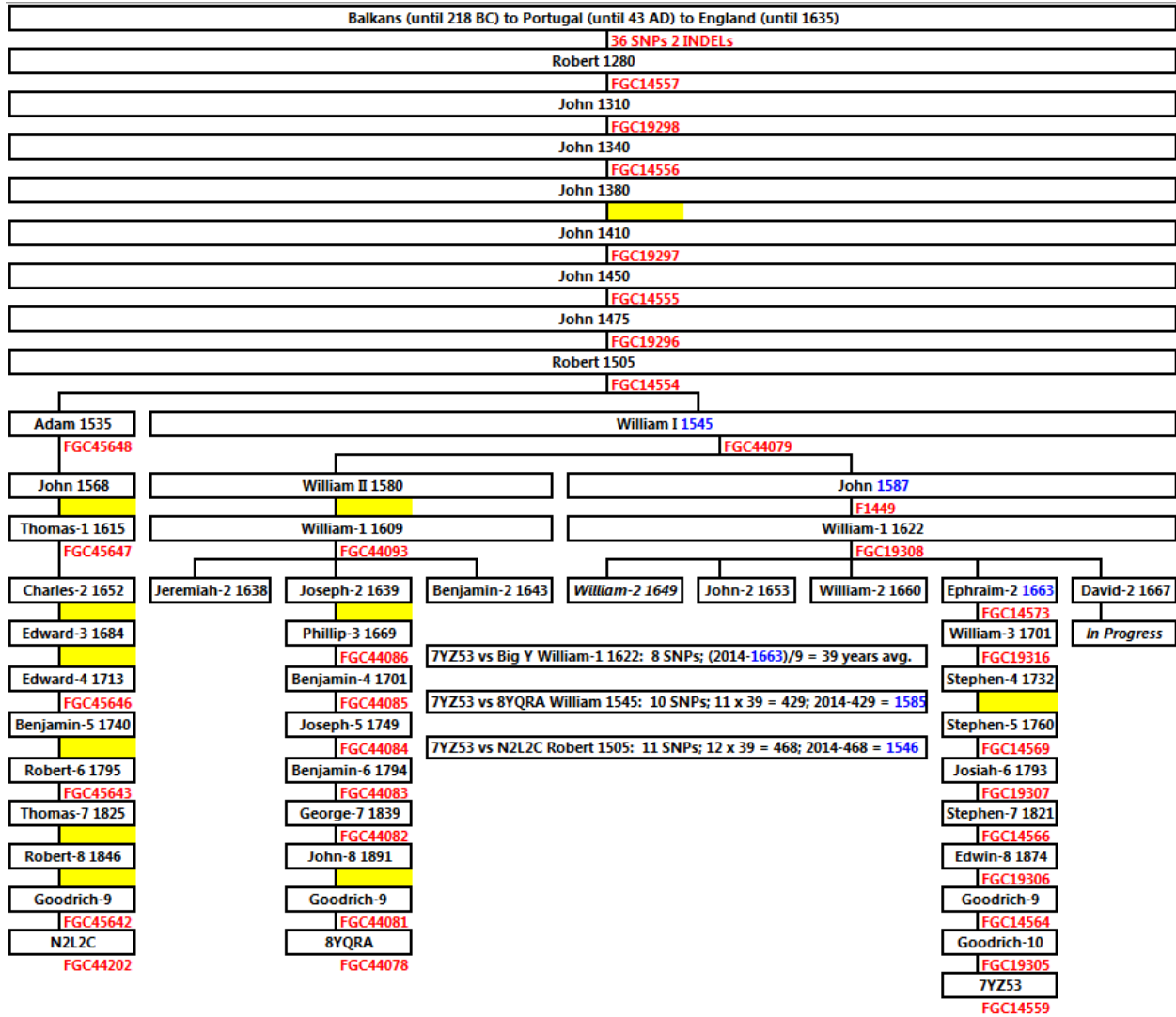


Figure 34. Preliminary suggested timing of Y-SNP/INDEL mutations in Felsham Goodrich Y-ancestry.

So G94 and G96 are more closely related than they are to G18 and G77 (Griswold; Figure 32). The accuracy of estimates of when SNP mutations occurred (Figure 34), and of Y-ancestries that are postulated on the basis of SNP and INDEL mutations shared with kits of known Y-ancestry, should improve with more tests, including kits of known Y-descendants of John-2, William-2, Ephraim-2 and David-2, and hopefully eventually known Y-descendants of John-1 Goodrich.

Immigrant John¹ Goodrich (1618-1680): 400-Year Anniversary of His Baptism

Immigrant John¹ Goodrich of Wethersfield, Connecticut was baptized at St. Mary parish in Bury St. Edmunds, Suffolk, England on 22 Mar 1617/8.⁷⁰ This date corresponds to 01 Apr 1618 in the modern Gregorian calendar after converting the New Year's Day from March 25 (Julian) to January 1 (Gregorian), and adding 10 days (*for a date in the 1500s-1600s; 11 days for a date in the 1700s up to the Gregorian conversion in 1752*).

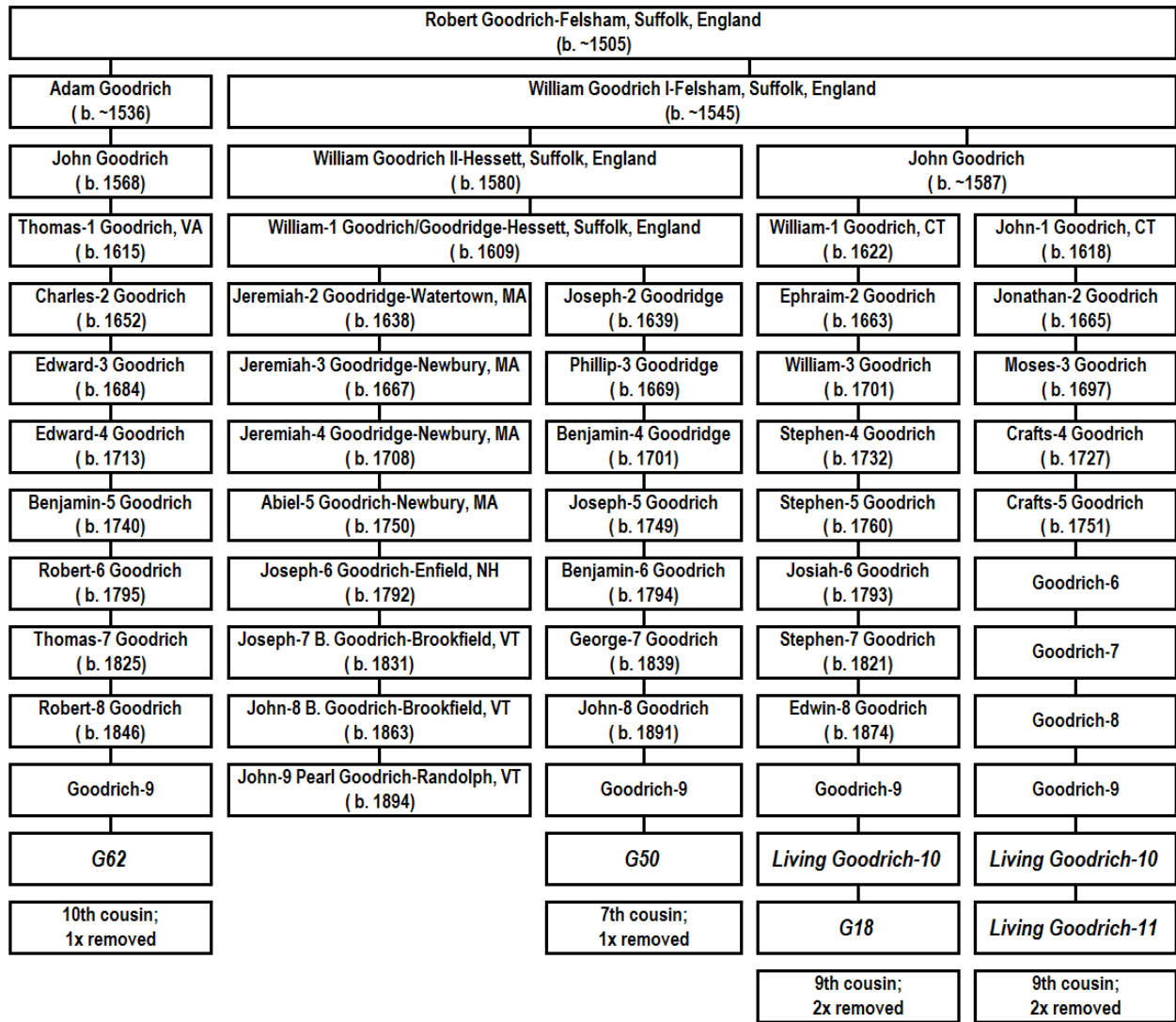


Figure 35. Felsham Goodrich ancestral chart: Dr. John Pearl Goodrich, MD vs. Y-Elite 2.0 Y-SNP kits, with the most recent postulated English ancestries of William⁻¹ Goodridge of Watertown, MA and Thomas⁻¹ Goodrich of Old Rappahannock, VA.⁷³

The 400th anniversary came to mind while I was finishing the article on Dr. John Pearl Goodrich and making an ancestral table (Figure 35) showing his relations to Y-DNA kits G50, G62, G18. While I was searching to see how far forward in time the column of male Goodrich descendants for John¹ Goodrich would extend shortly before the issue was to be published, potential surviving Y-ancestral lines for him began to emerge from a number of sources. Their Goodrich ancestors must not have communicated with the compilers of *The Goodrich Family in America* prior to its publication in 1889, since descendants of John¹ Goodrich extend no further than generation 4.⁷¹ *Hale House and Related Families*, (1952), which also extends the descendants' line of John¹ Goodrich no further than generation 4, has no dates of birth in his line after 1746.⁷²

Ironically, given the title of the main article of this issue (*no pun intended*), the potential surviving lines found so far are concentrated in the vicinity of Maine and New Hampshire. Though I had tried to find male descendants of John¹ Goodrich of Wethersfield on a number of previous occasions, it just happened that when I did the search this time I was already pointed in the right direction to find them. The value and urgency of an NGS Y-SNP test from at least one, and preferably more, Y-descendants of the immigrant John¹ Goodrich while they are still in existence is easy to appreciate, but this finding is still in the investigative stage and so was not ready for this issue. Status updates may extend into a number of issues in the future. Hopefully more information about this subject will be available in the future, and the coincidence of chronological proximity to the 400-year anniversary of the baptism of John¹ Goodrich is the one that is operative, rather than the more obvious, and less desirable (*especially under these circumstances*), coincidence that the day John Goodrich II was baptized is also April Fool's Day.
